Experience

Mark's portfolio spans a wide variety of projects and sectors, including education projects such as new build schools, school refurbishments, boarding houses and auditoria; commercial projects, including office headquarters, office fit-outs, hotels and residential developments and extensions; transport and infrastructure projects including London Underground projects and waste to energy facilities; leisure and sports facilities including swimming pools.

Mark is experienced in all stages of project work, including design, brief development, client and stakeholder interface, competition and bid submissions, strategic master plans,
